2. Allemansrätten

- Allemansrätten is the privilege of take part of and enjoying the nature in Sweden.

3. Camping

- You can almost always sleep one night in one place.
- If there is a risk of interfering someone, ask the landowner for permission.
- Do not damage forest plantations or other sensitive soils.
- To avoid disturbing those who are living in the area, keep in mind not to cross or be on anyone's premises.

4. Fire

- Do not start a fire if there is any risk - in the case of dry weather there is often a fire hazard.
- Select a place where there is no risk for the fire to spread.
- Keep water close to extinguish the fire. When you have started a fire, extinguish the fire properly.
- Do not leave any traces of fire in the form of a fireplace or similar.

5. Distance

- Do not pitch / camp near someone else's house or land. Have a sufficient distance.

6. Drive a car

- You are allowed to drive car on roads, but not on land and meadows.
- It is not permitted to drive with motor vehicles on individual roads that are suspended for motor traffic.
- You can usually park immediately next to the road if you do not disturb traffic rules, damage the ground and disturb landowners or traffic.

7. Rubbish

- All outdoor scrapping is prohibited. Leave it cleaner than you came. Help keep nature beautiful.
- We want a clean nature, free of rubbish so bring the garbage with you.
- Glasses, cans, plastic bags and capsules can damage both humans and animals.

8. Needs

- If you need to do your needs in the nature, dig it down. Clean and tidy it should be.

9. Land and forest

- Nature is fragile; we need to take care of it. Do not break branches and do not destroy the ground.

10. Bath and water

- You can swim almost everywhere in Sweden.
- Leave the place clean and tidy.

11. Hunting and fishing

- Hunting and fishing are not included in public law.
- You can fish freely with rods and some other hand tools along the coasts and in our five largest lakes.
- For fishing in other waters, a fishing license or other permit is required.
- Always keep in mind to ask for the rules where you want to fish.
- Do not leave ropes and hooks in the wild - they can be deadly for the animals.
- Leave the animals children and nests in peace.
- You are not allowed to take bird eggs. It is considered as hunting.
- Animal species threatened by extinction are protected by the fence, such as all frogs and snakes.

12. Gates

- When you are crossing gates, always close them. So no cows or other animal escapes.

13. Berries and mushrooms

- You can pick berries, mushrooms and flowers in nature. Everyone is not edible though. Pick carefully.
- Keep in mind that some plants are protected and they can't be picked.
- Do not take twigs, branches, nails and bark from growing trees. They can be damaged.

14. Protected areas

- Some areas are protected, parks and similar. Take care of these areas extra well. Here you can't camp.
