Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.


Romans 6:4

Baptism is the foundation of the Christian life. Here everything is given us freely, by grace. That is why we are generous in giving access to baptism. We welcome children, women and men who may be on their way to baptism.

Because of baptism we are called to live courageously, confidently and lovingly, with Jesus Christ as our role model. That is why we promote baptism as central to our own personal lives as well as to the life and work of the church.

The community of those who have been baptized expresses itself in the world-wide church and in relationships with link-dioceses and link-parishes. The church is always "glocal" – global and local. We hold each other in prayer and intercession. We recognise, affirm and develop each other's gifts. Active recruiting is part of the baptismal life.

Just as breathing in and breathing out sustains our bodily life, so the baptised life is both gathering and sending out. The mass is an expression of this dynamic: the gathering for communion in fellowship with Jesus Christ and each other, and the sending out from the altar into the life of the world.



#### ... TO MEET THE CHALLENGES LIFE AND THE WORLD BRING

The deep ambiguity that lies at the core of all things human means that we all experience disappointments, failure and evil. This is one of the many ways in which the church can live in critical solidarity with our society.
